

Financial support for rural terms - 2010

Valley to Coast provides financial support to GP registrars undertaking rural GP terms in order to encourage registrars to live in the town where they are undertaking their term and to help defray the costs associated with moving to a rural town.

This support is payable for all rural GP terms undertaken during training. It is not payable if the registrar commutes on a daily basis and only stays in the town when on call.

Relocation subsidy

We will pay up to \$2,000 per registrar per term to reimburse removalist expenses. Payment requires a tax invoice from the removalist and may be claimed at the start of Term.

Rental subsidy

We will pay up to \$220 per week as a rental subsidy per registrar. (If the practice pays for your rental accommodation, the subsidy will be paid to the practice). Payment requires evidence of rent paid. Payment will be made at the end of Term.

Internet/Telephone subsidy

We will pay \$60 per month per registrar as an internet/telephone subsidy. Payment requires an internet/telephone bill in your name. Payment will be made at the end of Term.

Note:

The financial support described above is available to registrars during their training. 'During training' means from commencement of training up until you have completed your training time. It does not include "Extension of Recognition as a General Practitioner while awaiting Fellowship" which is an administrative process designed to ensure that you still have access to a provider number during the period after you have finished training but before you have formally been awarded Fellowship.
